## Man Arrested After Search Yields Drugs, Guns

On Tuesday, March 31, 2009, shortly before 11:00am, Ardmore Police Narcotics Sgt. Kevin Norris and Cpl. Keith Ingle, assisted by Carter County Sheriff's Deputies and the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics, executed a search warrant at a residence in the unit block of Burton Street Southeast.

Upon entering the residence, officers made contact with the occupant, 47-year old Gregory Fagan. Fagan was only partially dressed, and asked for a pair of trousers from an adjoining room. Officers granted Fagan's request, and brought the trousers to him, noticing the unusual weight of the pockets before handing the garment over. Closer inspection revealed a loaded small-caliber semi-automatic handgun in one of the trouser pockets.

Additional search efforts revealed a second loaded handgun, cocaine, marijuana, and prescription pills in various locations around the property. Ardmore Police canine "Rikki" also assisted in the discovery of drug items.

Fagan was arrested pending charges of possession of a firearm after felony conviction, possession of marijuana, and possession of cocaine. Oklahoma DOC records indicate previous felony convictions on domestic abuse charges, as well as drug charges. It is unlawful for an individual with a felony conviction to possess a firearm in the state of Oklahoma, and penalties range from one to ten years in prison if convicted.
